

## **Andrea Sharp**

## **2021** Hall of Fame Inductee for Bowling Achievement

Andrea's high level of skill and fierce competitiveness makes her an outstanding selection for the Hall of Fame.

She began bowling in her hometown of Bad Tolz in Germany as a child. She accumulated state and city titles until

ultimately being selected for the Bavarian State Team, and winning the German National Title at 16 years old.

After a significant break from bowling, Andrea returned to the lanes in 2004 in Stafford. Working hard to return to competitive form, she has since earned an impressive list of accomplishments. Between the GFUSBCA and NCAUSBCA she has been awarded 10 Triple Crown Awards. She has bowled two 300-games (one of which made her the first and only woman to bowl a perfect game at Leatherneck Lanes in Quantico).

Traveling extensively to participate in tournaments, she has amassed many titles over the past decade including: 5 scratch and 3 handicap Virginia State titles, 9 scratch and 11 handicap Fredericksburg City titles, and 1 scratch and 3 handicap NCAUSBCA titles. Notably, Andrea placed 1<sup>st</sup> in the 2010 Storm National Mixed Tournament in the Women's Scratch Division, and 1<sup>st</sup> in the 2016 USBC Women's Championship Ruby Division Doubles.

Andrea's many accomplishments in the GFUSBCA continue to grow as she maintains her high level of bowling with dedicated effort and enjoyment of the sport.
