



Sport Bowling Tip: Start with benchmark ball

During practice, start with a ball that has a predictable reaction. Your "benchmark" ball will help you determine if you need a weaker or stronger piece of equipment. When you choose what ball to use, don't try to overpower the lane. Explore the entire lane during your warm-up session and determine where the friction is located. Allow the lane to help do the work. Coach Jon Kelly uses the analogy of hitting a nail with a hammer. "When all you do is focus on the head of a nail, your mind's eye will take the head of the hammer to the nail every time. As soon as we try to force the nail into the board, we miss it. If all we do is focus on the target, our mind's eye will take the arm swing through the target."
