

Mark your calendars - The Greater Fredericksburg USBC will hold its first annual meeting on May 6, 2006 at AMF Fredericksburg. Registration begins at 12:30 PM and the meeting begins at 1 PM. This is your vehicle to have your voice heard.

There are five board positions up for re-election (1^{st} VP, 3^{rd} VP, Director #1, Director #3, and Youth Director #4. All board positions are two-year terms. From the Association Manager...

Membership totals continue to rise with the current totals as of March 31st being 2,366, which includes both adults and youth. Both Local Only and "Grandfathered" memberships are reflected in the totals.

Tournaments

The last four months, with a tournament each month, has been a very busy time for all board members and volunteers who staffed these events. The Youth Championship held April 1st and 2nd at Liberty Lanes Massaponax was the last association tournament of the year. I cannot begin to tell you what a class act these youth bowlers are! They would put some seasoned adult bowlers to shame. The youth tournament experienced a delay of about a half hour on Sunday due to a scheduling conflict with another tournament being held at the center. The kids were patient and courteous allowing the other tournament bowlers to complete their games and vacate the lanes prior to attempting to claim their spots.

Annual Meeting

The first GFUSBC Annual meeting will be held May 6^{th} at AMF Fredericksburg. The meeting begins at 1 PM with registration at 12:30 PM. The Annual meeting (mandated by USBC) provides us with another means to report to our members and is a venue for members to have a voice in association decisions. Elections for two-year terms for five board positions are up for re-election in addition to several Delegate and Alternate positions for USBC Convention, VSWBA Annual Meeting, VSBA Jamboree & Annual Meeting, and VS Youth Jamboree. Final Averages

Final average requests are on their way to all fall leagues. A reminder to all secretaries: Final averages are due to the association no later than two weeks after the last week of bowling. Presidents should ensure final averages are submitted prior to authorizing any salary payment.

Summer League Dues

A new dues structure will be in effect for the summer leagues starting on or after March 15th, 2006 and reflects a USBC increase from \$8 to the \$10 maximum. In addition, both VSWBA and VS will now charge the \$1 maximum allowed under USBC bylaws. USBC Youth dues may increase if a proposed increase from \$8.50 to \$9.50 is approved at the April convention. If the increase is approved, youth dues will increase from \$12 to \$13.

Total Dues for Men = \$18 Total Dues for Women = \$18 with Women's State only **OR** \$19 with BOTH (Women's State and Men's State)

Remember, if you purchased your membership through a summer league last year, your membership is still valid until the new winter season (your card must state it is a USBC 05-06 Membership).

USBC Youth Award Changes for 2007

USBC will change the type of awards given for youth achievements beginning with the 2007 season. USBC will follow the national guidelines for high school athletics where only medals, pins, or patches given for score awards. Any youth earning an honor score award will have the opportunity to purchase a ring or plaque if they desire.

USBC Registered Volunteer Program

USBC is in the process of developing a USBC Registered Volunteer program that will eventually be mandatory for all associations. The program will be developed in compliance with National Council of Youth Sports and will require all youth volunteers to be registered and undergo a criminal background check and abide by the USBC Registered Volunteer Code of Conduct. The program is being created to protect the young people who participate in USBC Youth programs. More information will be forthcoming regarding this important program.

The Bowlers' Edge Brought to you by Bobby Phillips

Probably the easiest bowling tip I can give is actually a combination of several little things. I hear bowlers say all the time, "I hate the ten pin" or, if left-handed, "the seven pin. I just can't make them". What is amazing to me is that if I watch these same bowlers in warm-up or practice games, very rarely do I see anyone practicing to convert these troublesome corner pins.

One tip I received around 50 years ago was that when you first warm up, start slowly and really loosen up. I have found the best way for me to do that is to shoot a few corner pins (7's and 10's). You do not have to throw the ball hard to make a corner, just accurately. Turn your body slightly, so you are walking toward your mark, keeping your arm in line with the target. When you are practicing, play "low score" once in a while. The idea is to make at least one pin with each shot and if the ball goes in the gutter without striking a pin, score a strike or spare. The best score would be 20. That's pretty tough to do!

This tip can help the rest of your game, as well. If you watch your ball roll from beginning to end, as you shoot corner pins you can get a good idea of how the conditioner (oil) is laid out. Knowing this will help you perform other shots, as well. I could go on and on, but the important thing to remember is to *have fun*! Why do something if you are not having fun? Good luck and good bowling. If you have a question about this article, just ask me when you see me on the lanes. I am always willing to help!

Classes are: Super Seniors; 75 and up, Class A; 70 -74, Class B; 65 - 69, Class C; 60 - 64 and Class D; 55 - 59. There were over four hundred participants from all 50 states and 3 Canadian Provinces. Over 200 of these were men. I competed against 32 other gentlemen in the Super Senior Class. What great, diverse and friendly people. I bowled absolutely horrible the first day but came back the second day and finished up in sixth place, which was in the money. It was a lot of fun and I highly recommend it to anyone who qualifies for the National Senior Tournament.
