The Virginia State Youth Committee has named Brenda Chambers the 2008 volunteer of the Year. Brenda was recognized for her tireless work with young

bowlers in the Saturday Youth Legends League at Liberty Center Massaponax and involvement with youth bowling as a whole. She tirelessly directs league activities, encourages youth bowlers to enjoy their sport and organizes bowling trips requiring her to plan, direct and work fund raisers to support these functions. In addition to these contributions to youth bowling, she volunteers her time in numerous other ways. Brenda serves as Second Vice-President of our local bowling association and is very instrumental in organizing and managing GFUSBC tournaments as well as the Secretaries Workshop that is presented annually for league officers.

Tom Brady wins Singles Gold Medal in the 2008 Commonwealth Games.



Congratulations to Tom Brady for capturing the Gold Medal at the 2008 Commonwealth Games. Tom was the top seed after the first day of elimination-style qualifying of two three- game sets. In the opening round of day two, Tom had his

round of day two, Tom had his worst outing and dropped to 23rd spot after the three rounds but was granted an automatic spot in the semi-finals as the first day leader. With the field cut to eight bowlers, a two game series was shot to determine gold medal finalists. Tom rolled games of 215 and 211 to advance to the gold medal round. He was again seeded number one for his total pin fall in the previous 11 games and would roll the winner of the 2nd and 3rd seed qualifiers. He began Gold Medal play with two spare frames and then ran off nine consecutive strikes. His opponent could not match this performance and Tom won 255-199 to capture Tom's march to the gold medal was highlighted by his 214 average during the games. This is Tom's second tournament victory this year. In February he won the scratch invitational tournament hosted by the NCAUSBCA, also an elimination style tournament.

THE BOWLERS TO VETERANS LINK Representatives from the Greater Fredericksburg USBC, Paul and Cindy Rumbaugh, joined in national remembrance of America's veterans on November 11 at Arlington Cemetery. Members of the Greater Fredericksburg Association have a long-time involvement with the Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL), a national charity supported by the bowlers of America.

"The sacrifices made by America's service men and women can never truly be repaid," remarked BVL Board Chair Darlene Baker at the ceremony. "But we know that through BVL programs throughout the United States, we are making a real difference in the lives of our veterans and are so proud of each and every BVL local volunteer -- including Paul and Cindy -- that helped make this happen."

The Bowlers to Veterans Link was founded in 1942 to raise money for medical evacuation planes to ferry the wounded home from the battlefields of Europe. For more than 60 years, BVL has supported a variety of recreational and therapeutic programs designed to improve the lives of America's veterans.



The Bowlers Edge

Getting lined up

Getting lined up and staying lined up are two different tasks. Getting lined up refers to finding the initial combination of starting position, target, release and ball selection to maximize your scoring potential. Staying lined up refers to adjustments you can make as lane conditions change during a session

Lining up can be a challenging process. Each session, no matter how routine, must be approached with an open mind and a curiosity about the lane condition. Do not limit yourself by determining where you are going to stand and aim then use equipment to "fine tune." Sometimes the best option is to play a different part of the lane then you normally use.

Begin your practice by rolling your favorite ball on your favorite part of the lane. Watch the ball reaction carefully to see where it begins to curve and how much. Using this "benchmark" will help you determine what changes, if any, are needed. Also watch where other people are playing with success. Is it an inside or outside line? Especially watch people using a similar style to your own.

If the lanes are oily, plan to use a straighter line to the pocket. Trying to force the ball to curve more will lead to accuracy problems. If the lanes are hooking, you may need to use a softer release or less aggressive equipment. Sometimes moving to a different part of the lane will help you find the amount of oil that will be a better match to the ball selection and release you prefer. Generally the outside of the lane will be drier and the inside will have more oil.

USBC Youth Open Championship

The league is relatively small but the competition is strong and there is a lot of desire to participate in tournament play this year. We are working with Dave Brady on a consolidated plan for entering league members in the National Junior Tourney in Indianapolis. The league continues to fundraise through a variety of mean, recently receiving a \$250 corporate contribution from the Poole & Kent Corporation (thanks to league parent and board member Brian Downs, for making this possible). The Secretary/Treasurer fee is also being rolled back into the Tournament fund.

In the September 2008 issue of Lanes & Frames we provided an overview of the purpose and responsibilities of our Greater Fredericksburg USBC and an article on the duties of League Secretaries and Treasurers.

This page provides information about the creation of the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) and also lists responsibilities of your League President and Vice President.

United States Bowling Congress

The initiative to create one organization to govern the sport of bowling started in January 2000 through a joint effort of the American Bowling Congress, Women's International Bowling Congress, Young American Bowling Alliance and USA Bowling.

ABC, founded in 1895, was a predominantly male organization of nearly 1.6 million members. WIBC, founded in 1916, was exclusively a women's organization with nearly 1.2 million members. YABA, founded in 1982, served bowlers younger than age 22 and had nearly 400,000 members. USA Bowling started in 1989 with the purpose of having a single organization represent the sport as the national governing body and support the national team. Merging the four organizations together would create one organization to serve more than three million bowlers nationwide. While all of the organizations had great histories, they provided many of the same programs and services to their constituents. Today's business climate demands that such duplication of efforts be eliminated. Following that logic, leadership determined that consolidating organizations with virtually identical programs and services while expanding services to bowlers made good sense, assuring the continuity of valued programs and services for adults and youth.

Just a few of the benefits of the merger are: elimination of duplicate member services in the associations, reduced costs thru combined business operations, one stop shopping for league secretaries, members and proprietors, fewer meetings, better service to all the membership and unified marketing opportunities.

Duties of the League President

The president/league supervisor shall perform the following duties:

- 1. Preside at all league meetings.
- 2. Enforce all rules and regulations of the league.
- 3. Arrange to have an account set up in a recognized banking institution in the name of the league with the signatures of at least two officers required for all withdrawals.
- 4. Appoint a prize committee that will submit one or more prize lists for consideration by the fifth week.
- 5. Personally verify the league's bank balance monthly.

In youth leagues that have a board, the president shall assist the league supervisor with the duties of the president.

NOTE: "Verify" means the president must not only determine the amount on deposit, but also do the arithmetic necessary to determine how much should be on deposit. If the account is found to be short, the president must report the shortage immediately to USBC Headquarters for possible action under the bonding insurance policy.

All checks must bear the signatures of two authorized cosigners. Checks should not be made out to cash. The checkbook should be reviewed to verify entries made and to reconcile the appropriate bank statements.

Duties of the League Vice President

In the absence of the president, the vice president shall perform the duties of the president


